The accreditation of the schools of the district is reviewed annually to determine the school's compliance with state standards. Mountain View High School was classified as "Accredited-Cited" due to having two teachers who were in the second year of working on an additional licensure plan. This situation has now been corrected. All other schools in the district were fully accredited.

Mtn. View School District's federal programs, Title I program, Gifted/Talented Program, and Special Education programs, continue to provide services for students identified as eligible for those programs.

The District annually updates its technology plan and continues to add and improve technology available to staff and students.

District ACT scores have been reviewed and are above the state average.

Distance learning labs are used to enable the students in the district to receive classes from certified programs and institutions including additional AP classes.

More teachers are attending classes to achieve certification for teaching AP and Pre-AP classes.

The district continues usage of AlertNow services. The AlertNow service will alert parents and school staff, by means of an automated telephone system, of school closings due to inclement weather or for other reasons. The district urges parents to make sure their school is informed if phone numbers change throughout the school year.

The district is implementing the Common Core State Standards. These standards are now in place at all grade levels.
