- Priority 1: Literacy
1. A comprehensive review of results for the literacy portions of the Arkansas Augmented Benchmark Exams, ITBS exams, EOC exams, and other data sources for the 2012, 2013, and 2014 school years for Timbo High School, grades 7-12, was conducted. Data analysis reveals that the lowest average strand scores for the combined population on multiple choice items on the AABE are in the strand of Writing in which 65.00% of possible points were earned. On open response items on the AABE, the lowest average strand

areas for the combined population were in the Reading Practical Passage strand (5.23 out of 8 possible points or 65.42% of possible points were earned), the Writing Content Domain (6.10 out of 8 possible points or 76.25% of possible points were earned), and the Writing Style Domain (6.13 out of 8 possible points or 76.67% of possible points were earned). The lowest average strand scores for the combined population on multiple choice items on the 11th Grade Literacy EOC are in the strands of Reading Practical Passage in which 72.67% of possible points were earned, and Writing in which 72.67% of possible points were earned. On open response items on the 11th Grade Literacy EOC, the lowest average strand areas for the combined population were in the Reading Practical Passage strand (9.50 out of 16 possible points or 59.38% of possible points were earned), the Writing Content Domain (12.20 out of 16 possible points or 76.25% of possible points were earned), and the Writing Style Domain (12.23 out of 16 possible points or 76.46% of possible points were earned).

2. According to the 2013 state report card for Timbo High School, students who took the ACT exam had an average score of 18.33 in English and 18.33 in Reading.
3. According to the 2014 ESEA Accountability Report for Timbo High School, the graduation rate was 85.71%.

Goal To improve reading and writing skills with emphasis on analytical skills, recognition and use of Literary terms, vocabulary, punctuation and grammar.

Timbo High School students will meet trend data as measured by the appropriate State designated CRT examinations. In 2010-11, 62.86% of all students tested scored at or above proficiency. The goal for the 2011-12 school year was for at least 65.96% of all students to score at or above proficiency. The goal for the 2012-13 school year was for at least 69.05% of all students to score at or above proficiency. The goal for the 2013-14 school year was for at least 72.15% of all students to score at or above proficiency. The goal for the 2014-15 school year is for at least 75.24% of all students to score at or above proficiency.

Benchmark In 2010-11, 57.69% of the Targeted Achievement Gap Group students tested scored at or above proficiency. The goal for the 2011-12 school year was for at least 61.22% of students in the TAG Group to score at or above proficiency. The goal for the 2012-13 school year is for at least 64.74% of students in the TAG Group to score at or above proficiency. The goal for the 2013-14 school year was for at least 68.27% of students in the TAG Group to score at or above proficiency. The goal for the 2014-15 school year is for at least 71.79% of students in the TAG Group to score at or above proficiency.
